POLICY MATTER - ADMINISTRATION/FINANCE (88/2004)

(Decision taken on File No. NHAI/Misc./2004/Tech/CK)

Sub: Guidelines regarding Legal load limits of trucks.

Instructions were issued earlier vide NHAI Circular No. NHAI/Misc./2003/Tech/CK dated 03.02.2004 to ensure that the Contractors executing the widening and strengthening works under NHDP do not indulge in overloading of venicles and also do not seek permission from the State Transport Authorities to carry excess load in vehicles.

- 2. In this context, a copy each of the two Gazette Notifications laying down Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW) in respect of various types of goods vehicles is enclosed herewith. The Gross Vehicle Weight or trucks has been fixed keeping in view the design parameters and the load carrying capacity of roads.
- The All India Motor Transport Congress (AIMTC) has recently pointed out that the Contractors engaged by National Highways Authority of India are openly flouting the guidelines regarding legal load limits of trucks.
- 4. Overloading not only damages roads but also causes accidents. Ministry of Road Transport & Highways has been relentlessly pursuing with the States for strict enforcement of deterrent provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 to stop the practice of overloading.
- It is therefore reiterated that the Contractors should strictly observe the legal load limits of trucks while carrying construction material to the construction sites. Strict compliance in the matter is requested.
- This issues with the approval of Chairman.

NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, the 18th October, 1996

S.O. 728(E).—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 58 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 (59 1988), and in supersession of the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Surface Transport, No. S.O. 79(E), dated the 4th July, 1996, the Central Government hereby specifies that in relation to the transport vehicles (other than motor cabs) of various categories detailed in the Schedule below, the maximum gross vehicle weight and the maximum safe axle weight of each axle of such vehicles shall, having regard to the size, nature and number of tyres and maximum weight permitted to be carried by the tyres as per rule 95 of the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989, be—

- vehicle manufacturers rating of the gross vehicle weight and axle weight respectively for each make and model as duly certified by the testing agencies for compliance of rule 126 of the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989, or
- (ii) the maximum gross vehicle weight and the maximum safe axle weight of each vehicle respectively as specified in the Schedule below for the relevant category. or
- (iii) the maximum load permitted to be carried by the tyre(s) as specified in the rule 95 of the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989, for the size and number of the tyres fitted on the axie(s) of the relevant make and model, whichever is less:

Provided that the maximum gross vehicle weight in respect of all such transport vehicles, including multi-axle vehicles shall not be more than the sum total of all the maximum safe axle weight put together subject to the restrictions, if any, on the maximum gross vehicle weight given in the said Schedule:—

CIRCULAR

It has recently come to notice that one of the Contractors executing the widening and strengthening work under NHDP has requested the State Transport authorities for permission to carry excess load in vehicles to facilitate execution of the project. Hon'ble Minister for Road Transport & Highways has viewed this matter seriously as such overloaded vehicles not only endanger the safety of other road users but also damage the precious road infrastructure.

It may be ensured that Contractors do not indulge in overloading of vehicles and also do not make any such requests to the State Govts. to allow overloading.
